Horeb Senior Center. This review is to prevent falls with seniors, since Wisconsin has the highest number of falls in the country. Seniors are asked to bring in all of their medication, over the counter and prescription. Two local pharmacists, along with pharmacy students will spend one on one time with participants looking over their medication and suggesting any changes to the senior and their doctor. To qualify for this review a person has to be 65 years or older, must live in Dane County, have \$47,080.00 or less income for a single person or \$63,720.00 for a couple and have answered yes to a risk assessment. \$10.00 gift cards from the Mount Horeb Chamber of Commerce will be given to each participant. Beware of Scams! - Scams are happening all around us, big cities and small towns. Scammers are soliciting by phone, mail and computers. A local senior was just involved in a scam and wanted to share this experience. The senior received a phone call from a young lady pretending to be this person's granddaughter. (The scammers even had the correct name of this senior's granddaughter.) The granddaughter was crying and stated she had been involved in a traffic violation and was in jail. She did not want to call her parents for fear they would get mad at her. A man then came on the phone, who said he was a Dane County Sherriff and said they need \$2,000.00 for her to get out of jail. They told the senior to go to a "Best Buy" store and buy a gift card for \$2,000.00. The senior then went to "Best Buy" and bought the gift card with a check. The senior then went back to his car where the man called the senior again. He told the senior to scratch off the black area on the back card to see a code. The senior scratched off the area and gave the person the code number. The sheriff then said that because your granddaughter was verbally abusive to the police officer, they need another \$2,000.00 in a gift card from Target. The senior then went to Target to get another gift card. The senior talked with a sales person who saw "red flags". Target called the police, who are now involved in this case. They helped the senior call the bank to stop payment on the check. This senior was scammed because it sounded so real! Luckily the senior did not lose any money!

CASE MANAGER'S NOTE: CARRIE REESE

Depression: a True and Treatable Medical Condition- By GWAAR Legal Services Team

Depression is a true and treatable medical condition, not a normal part of aging. Older adults are at an increased risk of experiencing depression, yet depression in the elderly is often underdiagnosed and undertreated. Symptoms of depression overlap with symptoms of various medical illnesses, such as reduced energy, weight loss and sleep disturbance. This overlap makes the diagnoses of depression challenging. Depression is not just having "the blues". The effects of depression extend far beyond changes in mood. People become less energetic, experience changes in sleep patterns, appetites or a decline in physical health. It is a medical condition that is treatable like diabetes or hypertension. Changes in one's later life can cause depression like medical illnesses, death of a spouse or loved one and retirement. Depression can create a cycle and last for years. It can also make suicide more likely. Older Americans have the highest suicide rate of any age group. Treatment can help older adults better deal with long term problems, so they can enjoy their lives. Contact your doctor for more information.

FYI-STARTING JULY 1, SALADS WILL BE SERVED ON FRIDAYS AND NOT TUESDAYS

Eating to Keep Your Heart Healthy: Blueberries, strawberries, raspberries and asparagus are all beneficial because they are high in antioxidants. Oranges are high in potassium which help maintain blood pressure. Apples are good in removing cholesterol, which helps lower LDL (bad) cholesterol. Nuts are full of a good fat, which also helps lower cholesterol. Some cold water fish like salmon, trout and tuna reduce triglycerides and raise HDL (good cholesterol). Oatmeal (unprocessed, free of sugar) can also reduce cholesterol due to its beta-gluten content. Get out and get some fresh fruits and vegetables at your local store and or Farmer's Markets this time of year.
