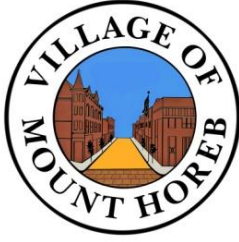

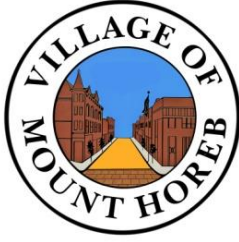

Brian LeDow spoke regarding his safety concerns and what he has seen

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Public Safety Committee

The Public Safety Committee of the Village of Mount Horeb shall be responsible to review and make recommendations to the Village Board regarding the operation of the Police Department, community event functions, traffic safety matters, and Village items affecting the fire/EMS district. Mount Horeb Village Code, § 1.19(4).

This includes, but is not limited to, review, discussion, and recommendations on the following matters:

- Policies, areas for focus, new or updated initiatives, training, and general operations of the Police Department
- The flow, speed, and direction of vehicle, bicycle, pedestrian, and other traffic, and the placement of stop signs, no-parking or handicapped/limited parking zones, crosswalks, and other traffic control devices, to help ensure the safe and orderly flow and parking of vehicle, bicycle, pedestrian, and other traffic on the public roads, streets and alleys within the Village
- The annual Police Department budget prepared by the Chief of Police
- Amendments to Village ordinances enforced by the Police Department
- Contracts, intergovernmental agreements, and other areas of cooperation between the Police Department and governmental entities or departments, either within or outside of the Village
- Appeals of denials of liquor license requests to the Village Board
- Other items as brought before the Committee by the Village Administrator, the Chief of Police, the Fire Department, the Joint Fire/EMS district, other committees or commissions of the Village, or the Village Board.
