

WINTER PARKING AND SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS

ALTERNATE SIDE PARKING No person shall park a vehicle on any public street in the Village (see also DOWNTOWN PARKING PROHIBITED below) between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of December, January, February or March, except as follows:

1. On even-numbered days of the month, vehicles may be properly parked between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on the even building numbered side of the street.
2. On odd-numbered days of the month, vehicles may be properly parked between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. on the odd building numbered side of the street.
3. Vehicles may be properly parked between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 2:30 a.m. on those "downtown" streets enumerated in par. (b) herein.
4. Vehicles may be parked in the angled parking stalls on the north side of East Main Street adjacent to parcels 06061231001 and 06061231201 with the understanding that the parcel property owner(s) shall be responsible for snow and ice removal within 24 hours for said angled parking stalls.

DOWNTOWN PARKING PROHIBITED. No person shall park a vehicle on either side of any of the following public streets in the Village between the hours of 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the months of December, January, February or March:

1. On Main Street between Washington and Fourth Streets.
2. On Front Street between S. Washington and S. Third Streets.
3. On S. Washington Street, Perry Street, S. Grove Street and S. Third Street all between Main and Front Streets.
4. On First Street and S. Second Street between Main and Lincoln Streets.
5. On N. Second Street between E. Main Street and the Village parking lot driveway.
6. On N. Third Street between E. Main Street and the alley immediately north of Main Street.
7. On N. Grove Street between W. Main Street and the Community Center driveway.

FIRE HYDRANTS. All property owners in the Village of Mount Horeb that have fire hydrants located on their property, or adjacent road right-of-way, shall remove all snow

and ice from a 2-foot radius around each fire hydrant. The said radius shall be cleared within a 24-hour period from the last snowfall.

Any property which is found to be noncompliant shall have, at the option of the Village, such snow and ice removed, and a charge for not less than \$50 per hydrant billed to them. If the bill is not paid within 30 days, the bill shall accrue at a rate of 12% per annum. Any outstanding bill amount and accrued interest will be placed onto the tax roll as a charge against the real estate, due and payable to the Village as any other non-installment assessment is payable.

Should a property owner be unable to perform their snow removal responsibilities, it shall be their responsibility to hire or enlist the help of others to ensure that the hydrant is clear from snow and ice obstruction. The property owner may call the Village Office to avoid being fined if all options to remove the snow have been exhausted.

In instances where a fire hydrant is located on a lot line, it shall be the responsibility of the property owner to the north or to the east to ensure that the hydrant is free from snow and ice.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL FROM PUBLIC SIDEWALKS. The owner, occupant or person in charge of each and every home or building in the Village fronting upon or adjoining any street and the owner or person in charge of any unoccupied building or lot fronting upon or adjoining any street, shall clean the sidewalk in front of or adjoining each home or building, or unoccupied lot or building, as the case may be, of snow or ice to the width of such sidewalk within 24 hours of the snowfall or formation of such ice or any continued snowfall and cause the same to be kept clear thereof; provided that when the ice has formed on any sidewalk so that it cannot be removed, the persons herein referred to shall keep the same sprinkled with ashes, sawdust or sand. In construing the provisions of this section, where the premises are occupied, the occupant or person in charge shall be deemed the person whose duty it shall be to comply with the provisions of this section.

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL FROM PRIVATE SIDEWALKS, DRIVEWAYS OR PARKING LOTS. No person shall remove or cause to have removed snow or ice from private sidewalks (those sidewalks not fronting upon or adjoining a street), driveways or parking lots into or on any public right-of-way without first obtaining written permission from the Village.

SNOW EMERGENCY The Chief of Police may declare a snow emergency when circumstances require and give such further directions or orders pertaining thereto as are within the authority granted him by the Village Board.

Upon the declaration of a snow or snow removal emergency by the Chief of Police or the Village Board in conjunction with the Director of Public Services, regulations necessary to make effective the provisions of this section are to be made. This subsection shall supersede all other parking regulations in force or posted on any street and shall require no posting of these emergency snow parking regulations.

When it becomes necessary to plow streets because the accumulation of snow thereon is causing a hindrance to traffic as constitutes an emergency unless promptly removed as declared, the Chief of Police or his designated subordinate shall, by appropriate public media, declare the beginning of an emergency and the application of emergency snow parking regulations, which regulations shall remain in force and effect until lifted by the Chief of Police or his designated subordinate. For the purpose of this subsection, the accumulation of snow on any streets or area sufficient for the application of emergency regulations herein shall be any such accumulation of snow which hinders the movement of traffic thereon or that impedes the ability of emergency and public transportation vehicles to travel safely and expeditiously over such streets or areas.

When necessary for the clearing, removal and plowing of snow or ice from any street or for other emergency or special conditions as declared, the Chief of Police or his designated subordinates are hereby authorized to make and carry out regulations and procedures sufficient to effectively cope with such emergency or special conditions to include:

1. Making temporary regulations directing traffic and regulating parking.
2. Such other and further regulations and restrictions as to traffic and parking as may be designated when necessary.

During such emergency, no person shall remove or cause to have removed snow or ice into or on any public right-of-way without first obtaining written permission from the Village.

Whenever a snow emergency exists as declared herein and any motor vehicle remains on the street or public parking lot in violation of this section, it may be removed by or under the direction of the Police or Public Services Department after one such department has attempted to notify the owner to remove such vehicle and it has not been removed. If such motor vehicle is removed by or at the direction of the Village, a reasonable cost of such removal may be charged against the owner thereof. The removal of the car by or under the direction of the Village shall not prevent prosecution under this section.
